ATD Midwest Chapters 2016 Regional Conference Recap



The Midwest ATD Chapters were able to participate in a pilot Regional Conference on November 14, in Chicago, Illinois. This one-day ATD Midwest Regional Conference was held at Hamburger University, McDonald's training campus and brought talent development professionals together from all over the Midwest.

The morning included a networking breakfast and a keynote from **Rob Lauber**, the **CLO of McDonald's Corporation**.

Rob Lauber is transforming McDonald's learning department to a "globally integrated strategic driver"



During his keynote, Rob shared the transformation McDonald's learning department is undergoing to take them from "disparate, redundant silos to a globally integrated strategic driver." This transformation includes eliminating many of the 15 learning management systems that are being used to deliver training, and finding new ways to train crew staff to get them operationally proficient more quickly. Rob shared how it is a slow process to undergo such a large transformation, but one that it is necessary to keep the business moving forward.

The afternoon consisted of three blocks of concurrent sessions ranging in topics from onboarding, to coaching, to facilitating virtual training as well as the opportunity to tour the Hamburger University Campus. The tours showed various aspects of the training facility including full mock restaurant set ups for experiential learning scenarios.
